Clear nights for the most part, and exceptional star gazing with the new moon. We were fortunate enough to catch the tail end of the Perseid Meteor Shower. (Mitch and Camille saw the peak on the 12TH). The Andromeda Galaxy was visible to the naked eye, even better with Phil's 9x BINOC'S.
- In an attempt to revive the rotted wood on the cabin's north wall, we gave it the fiberglass treatment (from the nautical world). Looks like it oughta work.

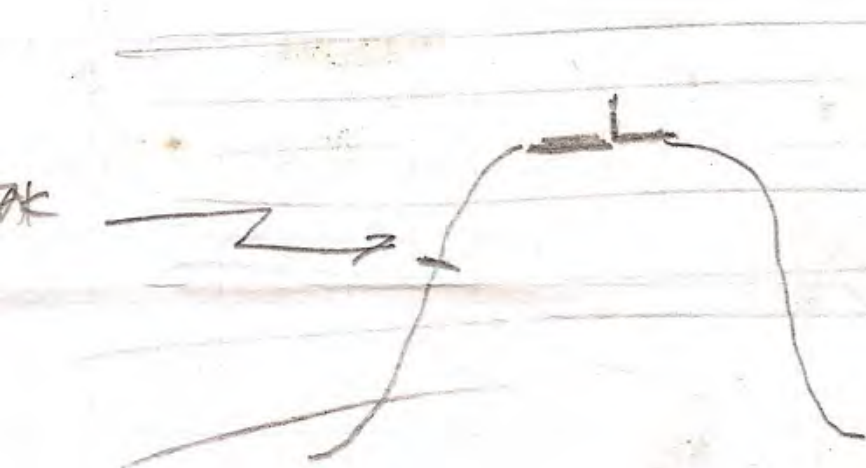
